GLOBAL INITIATIVES

In a highly selective national competition, CGTC was chosen by the University of Massachusetts and the U.S. State Department to create a two-year IT degree at Kabul Polytechnic University in Afghanistan, which has now been extended for a second year.

In CGTC's first year of eligibility, one student was awarded the prestigious Gilman Scholarship, which allowed her to receive academic credit while studying abroad in Scotland.

CGTC hosted 21 students from Libya for a full calendar year to equip them with the educational skills necessary to assume responsibility for maintenance operations at one of their nation's largest oil producers.

CGTC hosted 12 students from Colombia for a mini-semester of cultural activities and language immersion.
